Get Your Stuff Off the Floor

- Angled brackets on the wall are all it takes to create handy hangers for items like lawn chairs to riding toys.
- Fasten a few Bungee cordss into sturdy surfaces to securely hold basketballs, soccer balls and more.
- Mason jars are perfect for stashing nails and screws.
- A magnetic strip on the wall can be your go-to spot for frequently used tools like scissors and screwdrivers
- Large baskets will help you round up otherwise scattered items like beach gear or snow toys.

Organizing for Safety

If you walk through your garage every day, it's easy to overlook potential dangers, such as sharp tools and electrical hazards. Consider making safety a priority in your garage by following these guidelines:

- Store items securely. When storing heavy stuff, make sure your storage system can support the weight and your anchors are secure.
- Lock up your tools. Disconnect power tools when they're not in use and store them safely to keep them away from curious kids or thieves.
- Look after your lawnmower. Remove keys from lawn tractors to prevent kids from accidentally starting them.
- Inspect your garage door. Regularly test the autoreverse mechanism to make sure it's working as it should, and never let kids play with the garage door opener. Make sure the main garage door is locked and secured to prevent unauthorized access.
- Stock up on safety essentials. Equip your garage with a fire extinguisher, carbon monoxide detector, smoke alarm and a first aid kit.
- Spot tripping hazards. Spills on the floor, such as sawdust or oil, can cause someone to slip and fall.
 Uneven cracks or missing chunks of cement can present tripping hazards, too.
- Brighten it up. A well-lit garage is a safe garage.



- Then pull the blanket out using the straps.
- Make sure you wrap part of the blanket around your hands to prevent burning.
- Then carefully cover the flames, making sure it is all covered.
- After that, leave it for a while to make sure it is fully out and doesn't reignite.

It's vital to note that if the flames are bigger than the blanket, not to attempt putting out the flames yourself. You're better off getting out into safety and calling the fire brigade.

CAN MY PET BE A LIFE INSURANCE BENEFICI

What pet owner wouldn't want the best for his or her pet if the unthinkable happened?

Leona Helmsley is perhaps the most notorious example of someone leaving a beloved pet a small fortune. She bequeathed \$12 million to her dog Trouble when she passed away in 2007. That fortune let Trouble live out the rest of his days in a hotel, where he was cared for by a paid quardian and had an annual allowance of \$100,000 for full-time security, \$8,000 for grooming and \$1,200 for food.

Most of us don't have that kind of money to leave behind to a pet. So can life insurance provide the funds to let Fluffy live in comfort?

Generally speaking, insurance companies (including Erie Family Life Insurance) will not let you name a pet as a life insurance beneficiary because they are unable to sign off on legal documents.

Ingredients

Directions

- 1. In a large pot over medium-high heat, cook ground beef, onion, and garlic, stirring occasionally, until beef is browned. Add water, tomatoes, and taco seasoning, then cover and bring to a boil.
- 2. Break spaghetti in half and add to sauce. Reduce heat to medium, cover, and simmer until pasta is tender, 12 to 14
- 3. Remove from heat and stir in Velveeta, cheddar, and cilantro until cheese is melted. Serve topped with more cilantro and sour cream, if using.
